The Halton Fresh Food Box is a non-profit fresh produce buying service operated by and for our community.



The Halton Fresh Food Box saves you time and money as we buy directly from farmers and wholesalers.



We choose locally grown and Ontario grown products for the box whenever possible because we want to know where and how our food is produced, to support local growers, and to reduce the fossil fuels burned when we import food.



Volunteer truck drivers deliver the boxes to the neighbourhood drop-offs, where the local volunteer site coordinators ensure customers receive their boxes.

Here is an example of a box!

Lettuce, onions, bananas, potatoes, spinach, carrots, oranges, apples, broccoli, pears, cucumber, tomatoes, celery, squash, corn.

The difference between a small box and a regular box is in quantity not variety. The small box is best for singles and seniors. The regular box is best for four or more people. The box contents are seasonally selected

Everyone is welcome to participate! The more orders we have, the greater the buying power, and the better the variety.

How do I order?

- Choose your box size - \$8 or \$13 or \$17.
- Choose the drop site that works best for you.
- Get drop site contact information by calling 905-634-8645 or email foodbox@stchristophersburlington.com.
- Contact the drop site.
- Order and pre-pay for your box at least 11 days before the box is delivered.
- Come pick up your box at your drop site on the specified day and time. Reorder your box for next month.
- Enjoy great fruit and vegetables!
